At Ashakiran Hospital, Ayurveda and Panchkarma have been an integral part of disease management since the beginning of the OPD facility. Ayurveda was included as a service due to its efficacy with chronic illnesses and the holistic healing it offers while treating the root cause of the disease.

Ayurveda translates to 'knowledge of life.' The premise of Ayurveda is that disease is due to an imbalance or stress in a person's consciousness. Ayurveda encourages certain lifestyle interventions and natural therapies to regain a balance between the body, mind, spirit and the environment. Ayurveda treatment begins with an internal purification

process, followed by a special diet, herbal remedies, massage therapy, yoga and meditation.

Ayurveda encompasses preventive and curative management of all common health concerns. It predominately covers general medicine, psoriasis and skin diseases, diabetes, hypertension, pain management, respiratory disease, obesity, *Aamvata* (rheumatoid arthritis) and joint disease, hyperacidity, thyroid imbalance, spine disease, piles, trichology, infertility, chronic rhinitis, *garbhasanskar* (imparting knowledge to foetus within the womb).

# PANCHKARMA FOR ELIMINATION OF TOXINS, BODY REJUVENATION AND DISEASE MANAGEMENT

Panchkarma is based on the Ayurvedic principle that every human is a unique manifestation of five basic elements of ether (space), air, fire, water and earth. The combination of these elements gives rise to three *doshas* (*Tridosha*): Vata, Pitta and Kapha, and their balance is unique to each individual. When this *doshic* balance is disturbed, it creates disorder resulting in disease.

Panchkarma means the 'five actions or treatments' that are employed to cleanse the body of toxins accumulated due to poor diet and lifestyle. These toxins upset the balance of hormones and regulating

agents within the body. Panchkarma is customised to suit the individual's constitution, their *doshic* imbalances, age, digestive strength and immunity.

The five karmas in Panchkarma are:

- 1. Vaman
- 2. Virechan
- 3. Basti
- 4. Nasya
- 5. Rakthamoksha

Here are some commonly prescribed Panchkarma treatments and the symptoms they are used for:

• Snehan (oil massage): Different oils are used for massages in various conditions. Body massage is the best option for complete physical and mental relaxation. Snehan is used as a pre-procedure for Panchkarma therapy.

<u>Used for</u>: Stress, anxiety; dry skin, paralysis, facial palsy, myopathy, muscular dystrophy, spondylosis, lumbar pain, anti-aging treatment, skin health, improving body strength

• **Swedan (sweating):** Medicated steam is administered to the body to reduce pain and stiffness. Swedan is used as a pre-procedure for Panchkarma therapy.

<u>Used for</u>: Vata-prominent diseases like arthritis, joint pains; common cold, laryngitis, pharyngitis, tonsillitis, hiccup, asthma, heaviness of body, paralysis, cerebral palsy, nerve disorders, myopathy and muscle atrophy, contracture of joints, locked jaw, sciatica, obesity

 Vaman (vomiting): Cleansing procedure intended for expulsion of vitiated (abnormal/impure) Kapha. It is a painless, drug-induced vomiting to purify body of internal toxins to balance the hormonal system.

<u>Used for</u>: Female infertility (Polycystic Ovarian Disease (PCOD), anovulatory cycles, hypo/hyperthyroidism, uterine fibroids), male infertility, diabetes, anaemia, food poisoning, obesity, epilepsy, skin diseases, hyperacidity, hypercholestremia

 Virechan (purgation): It eliminates body toxins like vitiated Pitta. Drugs that stimulate bowel movement are administered for the expulsion of doshas through the rectum.

<u>Used for</u>: Hyperacidity, headache, epistaxis (nosebleed), skin disease, eczema, psoriasis, vitiligo, urticaria, leprosy, elephantiasis, recurrent abscess, hepatitis, jaundice, paralysis, piles, chronic fever, worms, gout, goitre, anaemia, obesity; burning of palm, sole, eyes; male infertility

• **Basti (enema):** In this procedure, enema of medicated oil or decoction is given through the rectum. <u>Used for</u>: Female infertility, male infertility, chronic constipation, irregular bowel habits, arthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, paralysis, joint pains, tingling and numbness; spondylosis, spondylitis, slip disc; weight gain/loss, kidney stone, epilepsy

• **Nasya (nasal application):** Nasya means administration of medicines through the nostrils. Medicated oils, ghruta and decoctions are administered into the nostrils to treat various diseases.

<u>Used for</u>: Diseases related with head, eyes, and nose; deviated nasal septum, allergic rhinitis, sinusitis, migraine, vertigo, hair loss, early greying of hair, insomnia, paralysis, facial palsy, parkinsonism, loss of smell, memory problems, frozen shoulder, locked jaw

 Raktamokshan (blood purification): In this specialised Panchkarma treatment, a minute amount of blood is removed from the body. Raktamokshan is carried out by different methods like leech therapy, bloodletting with syringe.

<u>Used for</u>: Skin diseases, jaundice, herpes zoster, varicose veins, trigeminal neuralgia, migraine, spleen, acute appendicitis

• Shirodhara (oil pouring on forehead): This is a relaxation technique in which a stream of warm oil is poured over a patient's forehead for an extended period of time.

<u>Used for</u>: Diseases connected with head, neck, eyes, ears, nose and throat; diseases of the nervous system (nerve disorder, facial palsy, paralysis, drooping of eyelids), long-standing insomnia and schizophrenia; epilepsy, cerebral palsy; skin health, hair loss, premature greying, and hair breakage

<u>Benefits</u>: Enhances blood circulation to the brain, improves memory, nourishes hair and scalp, provides sound sleep and calms the body and mind; improves digestion, sharpness of sense organs, quality of voice, strengthens the neck and head region; regulates mood and depression; improves concentration, intelligence, confidence and selfesteem; activates the pituitary gland which controls all other glands in the body (thyroid, ovaries, pancreas, liver, testis, adrenal)

• Padabhyanga (foot massage): It is a beneficial Ayurvedic treatment in which foot is massaged with medicated ghee using special grip techniques. The treatment has a calming and balancing effect on variety of disturbances of the autonomic nervous system.

<u>Benefits</u>: Calms the mind, maintain eyesight and hearing; promotes quality sleep, improves peripheral circulation; maintains foot health (eliminates dryness, cracked heels, numbness, pain, oversensitivity of the feet), helps to prevent sciatica, migraine, burning of eyes; calms and maintains the Vata dosha



## INAUGURATION OF DENTAL, COSMETIC AND IMPLANT UNIT

The dental, cosmetic and implant centre and fertility consultation services were inaugurated on 13th January, by his Lordship Bishop Malcom Sequeira. It was an intimate event attended by the staff of Ashakiran, trustees, priests and religious, donors/sponsors and ardent supporters.

'Thembe thembe tale sache' (a lake is formed one drop at a time) can summarise the sentiments that Saturday afternoon as Fr. Jeetendra threw light on how the hospital has evolved, spoke about Bishop Malcolm's staunch support, as well as reasons for the development/inclusion of the new units and services.



Sushmita Kujur welcomed all who were present and invited Fr. Jeetendra to address them. He spoke about how Ashakiran has grown from a care centre to a full-fledged hospital. When it initially began, the hospital wasn't making enough money to be able to renew the hospital licence. Bishop Malcolm was the one who supported the endeavour to have a diocesan hospital and sanctioned the process for the hospital licence. This jumpstarted Ashakiran in its journey. Recently, when faced with difficulties due

to the bad condition of the approach road in the monsoons, Bishop Malcolm took the initiative to get permission to build a proper permanent approach road.

With regards to the inauguration of the new units and services, Fr. Jeetendra spoke about how the dental unit evolved from a dental mobile van that went to slums, schools, etc. providing basic treatment and distributing free toothpaste and brushes. At that time, people were not very concerned with dental health. As the needs increased and Ashakiran grew, a few dentists practised at Ashakiran but it didn't sustain. Finally, Dr. Bhupesh and Dr. Tanvi shone some hope

since they joined Ashakiran and have been providing treatment. "We have been able to renovate the dental clinic because of the enthusiasm of the doctors; they have invested time and effort and it is reaping its results. There has been a good response and we have shifted to a bigger lab. Besides the dental and cosmetic unit, we have also started a consultation service/doctor for fertility issues. Infertility and its related problems are growing, and we are responding to the needs of the people by providing affordable services."



Fr. Jeetendra thanked and felicitated the workers—Gopal Mistri and Vinod, and their teams for the quick and efficient work on the renovation of the new units.

Each of the doctors were then invited to talk about their work and how it has developed. Dr. Bhupesh spoke about the dental unit, the services and treatments provided by Ashakiran—from basic to advanced ones, and about prosthodontics—a dental specialty that focuses on the restoration and replacement of teeth. *"Though we struggled initially to be at par with the latest dental units, we have worked hard, and we can now provide all the basic services under one roof with required specialty. We also have the implant centre which we can offer at a low cost."*

Dr. Tanvi expounded on the cosmetic centre and how it can provide the latest services and surgeries in order to respond to the changes in people's requirements—from basic needs to enhancements.

Dr. Kanchan Durugkar—the fertility consultant, then spoke about the need for affordable and easily accessible healthcare and treatment for women. Common persistent issues like PCOD and others can be detected through basic test and procedures. "Since health education in schools is rare and women's issues are not spoken about, women feel uncomfortable in reaching out for help, talking about the issues they are facing or even knowing how to care for themselves and plan a pregnancy or address infertility. Counselling and talking to fertility specialists make a big difference. We have been receiving patients from far."

Bishop Malcolm was then invited to speak. He spoke about this love for Ashakiran and how the hospital has grown over the years. He commended Fr.
